

R.S. Granoff Architect wins 'project of the year'

R.S. Granoff Architects of Greenwich, in collaboration with Hobbs Inc. of New Canaan, recently won three HOBBI Awards for a 10,000-square-foot Georgian style home they designed in mid-country Greenwich. This project won awards in three categories: "Fairfield County Project of the Year," "Best Green Custom Home" and "Best Custom Home 10,000 to 12,000 square feet." The home's environmentally friendly features include a rooftop photovoltaic system that generates electricity, warmboard radiant heat at all floors, no-added formaldehyde wood products and no-VOC sealants, adhesives and finishes throughout.

Granoff Architects also won a HOBBI Award for "Best Spec Home: \$5 to \$6 Million" for a home the company designed on Thunder Mountain Road in Greenwich. The house was built by Vanguard Construction Corp.

HOBBI Awards were given out by the Home Builders Association of Connecticut at its annual awards ceremony at the Aqua Turf Country Club in Southington to recognize the excellence in building and home design.
